

### What is Double Action Frenzy?

Cost is \$1.00 per 5-page booklet.

First games to be played at the Afternoon, Evening and Late-night events.

The Double Action Frenzy's are considered warm up games to start the event. There are 5 pages in each booklet for \$1.00, you play for 2 lines anyway on each page. There are 2 numbers in each square if the Caller calls either number you can cover the whole square.

### What is an Earlybird?

Cost is \$1.00 for a strip of 3 (3 faces).

Played right after the Double Action Frenzy's.

The Earlybird is a strip of 3 cards. The Caller will call 3 numbers at the beginning of the event which are called "WILD numbers, prior to the game being played you cover everything "ending only" in those 3 numbers, when it is time to play the game the Caller will continue to call numbers till someone has a full card (blackout).

### What are Nickels?

Cost is 6up for \$2.00 or 9up for \$3.00 – 5-page booklet.

These games are played right after the Double Action Frenzy's.

There are 5 different games 1 game per page. Played at the Afternoon, Evening and Late-night events.

### What is the Double Action Progressive?

Cost is \$2.00 each (per face).

Played just before the Regular games begin.

This card has 2 numbers in each square if the Caller calls either number you cover the entire square. A portion of the sales goes to the progressive and a portion goes to the main prize. The game is played to a full card (blackout). The fun part is when you get down to having one square left open you will need only 1 of the 2 numbers in the square to win. If you win the game in 35 numbers or less you win the progressive portion of the game if not, you win the main prize portion of the game.

### What are Regular Games?

The Regular Games are the main part of the program, you purchase a booklet of cards, each having 8 pages in it. You will play anywhere from 1 to 4 games on one page depending on what the program indicates. Each event has a different amount of REGULAR games, Mornings: 21, Afternoons: 27, Evenings: 30, Late Nights: 28. The cost of the cards are listed under cards prices.



### What is a WILD 6-4-Baseball?

Cost is \$1.00 for a strip 3 (3 faces) or a strip of 9 (9 faces) for \$4.00.

Played at just before intermission.

A WILD 6-4-Baseball is a 3 up card which means it has 3 faces on it. The first thing you need to do is cover everything ENDING only with 6-4 and 9.

Then you need to get a group of 6 numbers (called a 6 pack) (rectangle) on the TOP card (no free), a group of 4 numbers (called a stamp) (not using the free space) on the MIDDLE card and a group of 9 numbers (called a baseball) on the BOTTOM card, all at the same time to win.

### What is a Houdini?

Cost is \$1.00 for a strip of 2 (2 faces).

Played between pages 6 and 7.

The Houdini is a 2 up card, when the Caller starts to call he/she will call a number like N-32, this means you cover N-32 and the reverse number I-23, if G-53 is called you will also cover N-35, if B-10 is called you will also cover B-1, if B-14 is called you will also cover N-41 and so on till you have a full card (called a blackout).

### What is the Houdini Progressive?

A portion of the Houdini prize is put in a pot and grows at each event.

A number is called at the beginning of the event and is considered the Houdini Magic Ball, if instance if the number is 23 and you win the Houdini game on either 23 or 32 you win the progressive component to that game. If the number is 46 and you win on 46 or 64 you can win the progressive as well and so on.

### What is a Bonanza?

Cost is \$1.00 per card (1 face).

Played at the end of the program.

The Bonanza is a single card, there is pre-call of 46 numbers at the beginning of the event and posted on the BONANZA boards around the hall.

Throughout the event you can cover numbers on your card from the Bonanza boards at your leisure. If you have a 7 or less that is usually considered a good card to go into the game with. We will finish off the event by playing the Bonanza for a full card and then carry on for a consolation prize. The first full card(s) will receive the main prize, split if more than one winner and the next full card(s) will win the consolation prize again, split if more than one winner.

### What are Pots?

A Pot is a progressive game you buy into if you like. There are 3 different pots at each event. Loonie Pot, Pot of Gold and Match Ball at the Afternoon and Evening events.

**Loonie Pot** is played at the Afternoon and Evening Events, it cost you \$1.00 to buy into it. At the beginning of the event the Caller will call a number for the Loonie Pot Ball, if you win on that number on any of the Regular games excluding the last game of any page you win the progressive pot.



**Pot of Gold** is played at the Afternoon and Evening Events, it cost you \$1.00 to buy into it. At the beginning of the event the Caller will call a number for the Pot of Gold, if you win on that number on the last game of any of the Regular Games you win the progressive pot.

**Pot #3** is played at the Morning and Late-Night events, it cost you \$1.00 to buy into it. At the beginning of the event the Caller will call a number for Pot #3 ball, if you win on that number on any of the Regular games excluding the last game of any page you win the progressive pot.

**Pot #4** is played at the Morning and Late-Night events, it cost you \$1.00 to buy into it. At the beginning of the event the Caller will call a number for Pot #4, if you win on that number on the last part of any of the Regular Games you win the progressive pot.

### What is the Match Ball Progressive?

The Match Ball costs you \$2.00 to buy into and is played only on the Regular games.

If you win on a number that matches the number of balls called, you win the progressive. So, if you win on B15 and it is the 15 number out you win the pot, it is G54 and you win on the 54 number out you win the pot and so on.
